COMMUNITY DINNERSMarch Mission of the Month

The first community dinner was held in September 2015 after a sermon Pastor Melanie gave about hungry people living in our own community. Immediately several parishioners got together and decided to do a dinner at the end of

the month when many run out of money and food. That first dinner served about 25 people, most of them parishioners. Today we serve an average of 90 people, most coming from the wider community. This has become a flourishing ministry of the church.



What does it take to put these dinners on? Many hands attached to big hearts who give of their time, talents, labor and money. Planning, coordinating, buying, cooking, serving, security, set up/tear down, clean up. This is a labor of love. It is also expensive.

Many people who do the cooking/baking also contribute the costs of the food. This was doable when we were feeding 40 to 50 people. Now that we are averaging close to 100 every month though, it is becoming cost prohibitive to continue to do it this way. People

who sign up to prepare something go to their local grocery store and pay retail prices for the ingredients of that dish. Not only is this expensive but it means we are not being the best stewards of our monies.

The committee is trying to get a handle on the cost per person so

people are being asked to turn in their receipts even if they are not asking for reimbursement. This is the only way to gauge what we actually spend each month. If we want to continue this ministry and feed even more people, we need to find better and more cost effective ways to do

this. One way is to purchase food and paper goods in bulk at a wholesale restaurant supply store, such as Restaurant Depot. To do this however, there needs to be money in the bank to cover these purchases.

Our community dinners have become a staple in our community and is a dynamic ministry of the church. Please give generously so we may become better stewards and provide even more meals to those most in need.

NOTE: March's Dinner is on March 22nd instead of the last Thursday.

The newest culmination of these efforts is the N.E.W. program on the first and third Friday nights at 7 pm. Musicians from our own congregation saw a need for a different type of worship and came together to make it a reality.

Do you have a flare for the dramatic or a musical talent? Maybe you envision yourself as a great organizer or technical support person. New Experience in Worship 1st & 3rd Fridays Monthly


1st & 3rd Fridays Monthly 7:00pm
